A property owner gave his opinion on the idea of property owners maintaining water lines from the main to stop box. Estrem clarified that this is something he learned at training that other communities around Iowa are discussing.

Motion was made by May, seconded by Erickson, to approve Resolution #4 (2022-2023): Pay app #11 from Story County Construction for the WWTF. Motion approved with a vote of 3-0.

Motion was made by Newman, seconded by May, to approve Resolution \$5 (2022-2023): Pay app # 3 from Absolute Solution for the WWTF. Motion approved with a vote of 3-0.

Council discussed and reviewed the renewal of Alliant Franchise again. There are still a few questions before they move on the process of renewing.

Motion was made by May, seconded by Erickson, to approve the fireworks permit for Slater Community Club / Tailgate event on September 8 @ approximately 10pm. Motion approved with a vote of 3-0.

Motion was made by May, seconded by Erickson, to approve the Street closure on September 8<sup>th</sup> for the Tailgate Event - Main Street from Tama to Story (to driveway west of City Hall). Motion approved with a vote of 3-0.

Motion was made by Erickson, seconded by Newman, to approve the Street closure on October 15<sup>th</sup> (rain date of Oct 16<sup>th</sup>) for a Market to Table Event / fundraiser for the new Event Center/Library Main Street from Tama to Story. Motion approved with a vote of 3-0.

Motion was made by Erickson, seconded by May, to approve Resolution #6 (2022-2023): Contract with Alliant Energy to put in a gas main extension from 10<sup>th</sup> Ave to the Sewer Treatment Facility. Motion approved with a vote of 3-0.

EMS has 2 new members that will be going starting training this fall.

Estrem reported they have been replacing the filtering medium in the softeners/water plant; and they will be installing speed signs on Main Street.

Davies, with the help of Erickson, will be applying for the Iowa State Visioning Program.

Motion by May, seconded by Newman, to adjourn the meeting at 8:25pm. All Ayes.
