As we continue the design process, we want the community to have the opportunity to provide as much guidance as possible. Will you help us by filling out our short survey no later than <u>Tues., Sept. 3</u>? Two options:

Your feedback will provide us with information that will help us make this facility meet the needs and wishes of Slater citizens and help us tailor this project to garner the support we need to make this building a cornerstone of our Main Street and our community. We'd like to know how you use the library or would like to, and how you use our community spaces (Log Cabin and Senior Center) or would like to.

With funds from an Iowa Rural Enrichment Grant, our architect, FEH Design is currently working on revised plans for the project incorporating City Hall into our design plan. We have also adjusted the size of the building to align with community feedback, making the overall project more cost-effective. Stay tuned for more details and revised floor plans in September.

Fundraising events such as the upcoming Golf Tournament and Gather Farm-To-Table Meal keep adding to the \$2+ million raised, donated, and pledged to the project by our community and our city.

In November, we will be asking Slater citizens to vote on a \$2.5 million bond. Passing a bond for a portion of the costs of the building will move us to the next step in funding: grant writing. Continued fundraising, a passed bond, and grants will allow us to be shovel-ready as soon as possible. Additional information on the bond will also be communicated in September.




Book Club


In November, Meet-n-Eat will be held **Friday**, **November 1**.

board and pieces if possible.



Nuisance Abatement Procedure

50.02 NUISANCES ENUMERATED. The following subsections include, but do not limit, the conditions that are deemed to be nuisances in the City:

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 657.2)

- 5. Blocking Public and Private Ways. Obstructing or encumbering, by fences, buildings or otherwise, the public roads, private ways, streets, alleys, commons, landing places, or burying grounds.
- 7. Storing of Flammable Junk. Depositing or storing of flammable junk, such as old rags, rope, cordage, rubber, bones and paper, by dealers in such articles within the fire limits of the City, unless in a building of fireproof construction.
- 9. Weeds, Brush. Dense growth of all weeds, vines, brush, or other vegetation in the City so as to constitute a health, safety, or fire hazard.

Solid Waste Control

- 105.03 OUTDOOR STORAGE OF MOTOR VEHICLES. The outdoor storage of motor vehicles that are not deemed to be junked vehicles can detract from the beneficial use and enjoyment of neighboring properties; therefore, certain special regulations are established as follows:
 - On property zoned for residential use, no person shall keep, store, or display a motor vehicle out of doors or permit the parking out of doors of a motor vehicle on property under said person's ownership, possession, or control for more than 15 days without movement and use of said vehicle as an operating motor vehicle.
 - 2. On property zoned for commercial use, no person shall store or display one or more motor vehicles out of doors, or permit the parking out of doors of a motor vehicle on property under said person's ownership, possession, or control for more than six months without movement and use of said vehicle as an operating motor vehicle.
 - 3. The provision of Subsection 2 notwithstanding, the keeping, parking, or storage, out of doors, of any wrecked or demolished motor vehicle, or motor vehicle stripped for parts, at the same commercially zoned site for more than 90 days is prohibited.
 - 4. The following are exempt from the regulations of this section:
 - A. Vehicles kept fully enclosed inside a building or an area surrounded by a solid opaque fence or wall of uniform design and color not less than six feet in height and in compliance with applicable subdivision and zoning regulations; or
 - B. Vehicles kept in a lawfully established, commercial automobile salvage yard; or
 - C. A motor home, pickup truck with a camper top, converted bus or van, or similar recreation vehicle, which is currently licensed for operation on the public highways; or
 - D. A motor vehicle currently licensed for operation on the public highways lawfully parked off the streets while the owner or the other person in lawful possession and control thereof, if a resident of the this City, is out of the City for more than fifteen days but not more than 180 days; or
 - E. Vehicles which are immobilized pursuant to an immobilization order of the District Court.

105.05 BUSINESS ACTIVITIES. Even though it may serve a reasonable functional purpose or have a direct supporting relationship to a responsible person's lawful use of the real property, a responsible person shall not place or store on real property used for commercial or industrial purposes, for a continuous period of more than seven days, except inside a building or inside a waste container or inside an area fully enclosed by a solid opaque fence or wall of uniform design and color not less than six feet high, any of the substances or materials described in the following subsections. These substances and materials, under the circumstances described in this section, shall constitute solid waste for purposes of this chapter.

- Garbage, refuse, and rubbish.
- 2. Food and food containers.
- 3. Debris resulting from the construction, maintenance, repair, or demolition of buildings, fences, roadway paving, communications systems, structures, and other improvements to real property.
- 4. Building materials salvaged from the construction, maintenance, repair, or other demolition of buildings, fences, roadway paving, communication systems, structures, and other improvements to real property.
- 5. Previously used or damaged or inoperable household furniture, furnishings, fixtures, appliances, utensils, equipment, and supplies.
- 6. Salvaged parts of previously used cloth, paper, wood, metal, glass, and plastic products.
- 7. Any motor vehicle subject to the registration laws of the State that is not currently registered
- Previously used vehicles, machinery, equipment, tools, and appliances that arein a state of disrepair that renders them presently incapable of being used or operated for the purpose for which they were originally designed and manufactured.
- Disassembled parts from previously used vehicles, machinery, equipment, tools, and appliances.
- Previously used petroleum products.
- 105.06 WASTE CONTAINERS. Responsible persons shall provide and make available for the use of all persons occupying the real property sufficient waste containers for the temporarystorage of all solid waste containing food, food containers, and other garbage that is produced by the activities conducted on real property.

SAHA INSTALLS TRAIL SIGNS PROMOTING SLATER'S HISTORY

Take a walk or ride and check them out!



The Heart of Iowa Trail Sign

SAHA knew it wanted to put informative signs on our two trails running through Slater, the Heart of Iowa Trail and the High Trestle Trail. Thousands pass through Slater on these trails each year.

Board member Robert Vespestad worked with the City, sourced the appropriate signs, put together the installation of the signs, and a bench and bike rack at the location on the High Trestle Trail, the site of the old Hobo Jungle. Another sign went up near the Arboretum on the Heart of Iowa Trail. We are grateful to the families of Jackie and Gus O'Donnell and Max Raines, which donated to the project in memoriam.



The Hobo Jungle site

The sign on the old Chicago Northwestern Railroad bed is located about 3/4 of a mile south of Slater on the High Trestle Trail. The Hobo Jungle, as the locals called it, consisted of a group of shrubs and trees and an area where a fire could be built for cooking and for warmth. In recent years Slater's children have played at the spot, perhaps building fires and telling hobo stories. Today there's a comfortable bench and a bike rack with the sign commemorating the Hobo Jungle site.

The second sign which is near the big County sign on
the Heart of Iowa Trail, the Milwaukee Road rail bed, is
just east of the Arboretum and tells the story of Slater,
a town that exists because of the trains, the story of
The Town that Moved and of the Great Train Wreck of
1913. It describes Slater's existence and growth
because of the railroads.
